ένδυναμοῦ PPImp2sg fr. ένδυναμου
to become able to function or do something, become strong, usually of inner or moral strength,
'be strong'
to cause someone to have the ability to do or to experience something, to make someone able, to
give capability to, to enable, to strengthen, to empower

χάριτι
a beneficent disposition toward someone, favor, grace, gracious care/help, goodwill
to show kindness to someone, with the implication of graciousness on the part of the one
showing such kindness, to show kindness, to manifest graciousness toward, kindness,
graciousness, grace

μαρτύρων
one who affirms or attests, testifier, witness
a person who witnesses, witness, one who testifies

παράθου AMImp2sg fr. παρατιθημι
to entrust for safekeeping, give over, entrust, commend, entrust something to someone, for
safekeeping or transmission to others
to entrust oneself to the care of someone, to entrust oneself to, to commit oneself to the care of

πιστοῖς
pertaining to being worthy of belief or trust, trustworthy, faithful, dependable, inspiring
trust/faith, 'reliable persons'
pertaining to being trusted, faithful, trustworthy, dependable, reliable, 'pass these on to reliable
men'

ίκανοί
pertaining to meeting a standard, fit, appropriate, competent, qualified, able
pertaining to being adequate for something, adequate, qualified

έτέρους
pertaining to being distinct from some other item implied or mentioned, other, others
pertaining to that which is other than some other item implied or identified in a context, other,
another

διδάξει AAIInf fr. διδασκω
to provide instruction in a formal or informal setting, teach
to provide instruction in a formal or informal setting, to teach, teaching

V. 3

συγκακοπάθησον AAImp2sg fr. συγκακοπαθεω
suffer together with someone, 'suffer hardship with (me) as a good soldier' cf. 1:8
to undergo the same type of suffering as others do, to join in suffering, to assume one's share of
suffering, to suffer together, 'join in suffering as a good soldier of Jesus Christ'

καλός

pertaining to being in accordance at a high level with the purpose of something or someone,
good, useful, of moral quality, good, noble, praiseworthy, contributing to salvation, etc., in any
respect unobjectionable, blameless, excellent
pertaining to a positive moral quality, with the implication of being favorably valued, good, fine,
praiseworthy

στρατιώτης

soldier, figurative with the major component of allegiance to a commander in the central
meaning of 'soldier' as defining aspect, 'a soldier of Christ Jesus'
a person of ordinary rank in an arm, soldier

V. 4

στρατευόμενος PMPtcpMSN fr. στρατευω
do military service, serve in the army
to engage in military activity as a soldier, to serve as a soldier, to be a soldier

ἐμπλέκεται PM/PI3sg fr. ἐμπλεκω
to become involved in an activity to the point of inference with other activity or objective, be
involved in, 'become entangled in civilian pursuits'
to become so involved in some activity as to experience severe restrictions as to what one can do,
to become involved, 'no one who is a soldier becomes involved in the affairs of civilian life'

βίου

life and activity associated with it, life, 'the affairs of everyday life'
to conduct oneself, with focus upon everyday activity, to live, daily life, life, existence

πραγματείας

activity, occupations, undertakings, business, affairs, 'the affairs of everyday (civilian) life'
activities involved in one's behavior or conduct, affairs, pursuits, 'no soldier gets mixed up in the
affairs of daily life'

στρατολογήσαντι AAPtcpMSD fr. στρατολογεω

gather an army, enlist soldiers, 'the one who enlisted (him)'
to cause someone to be a soldier, to enlist soldiers, 'no soldier gets himself mixed up in civilian
life, because he must please the man who enlisted him'
to be a commanding officer of a group of soldiers, to be an army commander, to be an army
officer, 'no soldier gets himself mixed up in civilian life, because he must please his army officer'

ἀρέση AAS3sg fr. ἀρεσκω
to give pleasure/satisfaction, please, accommodate
to cause someone to be pleased with someone or something, to please

V. 5

ἀθλή PAS3sg fr. ἀθλεω
ἀθλήση AAS3sg fr. ἀθλεω
to compete in a contest, compete, of athletic contests in the arena
to engage in an athletic contest, with emphasis upon completion, to compete, ‘one who competes in an athletic game cannot win the prize unless he competes according to the rules’

στεφανοῦται PPI3sg fr. στεφανοω
to encircle someone’s head with ornamental foliage, wreath, crown, of the winner in an athletic contest
to cause someone to receive a prize or reward as the result of excellence in competition, to give a prize, to provide a reward, ‘he will not receive the prize unless he competes according to the rules’

νομίμως
pertaining to being in accordance with normal procedure, in accordance with rule(s)/law,
‘compete according to the rules’ cf. 1 Tim. 1:8
pertaining to being correct according to rules and regulations, correctly, according to the rules

κοπιῶντα PAPtcpMSA fr. κοπιαω
to exert oneself physically, mentally, or spiritually, work hard, toil, strive, struggle
to engage in hard work, implying difficulties and trouble, hard work, toil, to work hard, to toil, to labor

γεωργὸν
one who owns a farm, farmer
one who engages in agriculture or gardening, farmer, gardener

καρπῶν
produce or outcome of something, fruit, of plants
that which is harvested, harvest, crop, fruit, grain

μεταλαμβάνειν PAInf fr. μεταλαμβάνω
to share or participate in something, have a share in, ‘receive one’s share of the crops’
to receive as one’s share in or as one’s part of, to receive a share in, to have a share of, ‘the farmer who has done the hard work should have the first share of the harvest’

νόει

PAImp2sg

fr. νοέω

to think over with care, consider, take note of, 'consider what I say'

to think over a matter with care, to think about carefully, to consider well, 'think carefully about what I am saying'

δώσει

FAI3sg

fr. διδωμι

to give something out, give, bestow, grant

marker of a causative relation, with otherwise almost empty semantic content, to cause, to bring about, to produce

γάρ

marker of cause or reason

marker of cause or reason between events, through in some contexts the relation is often remote or tenuous, for, because

σύνεσις

the content of understanding or comprehension, insight, understanding, insight into, understanding of something, cf. Eph. 3:4

that which is understood or comprehended, understanding, what is understood
